A message from Pastor Mark



We're going to do Maundy Thursday a lot differently this year, and I think you'll find it very interesting.

The actual Last Supper (the *first* Last Supper) was almost certainly not a Passover meal. How can I say this? Three of the four gospels – Matthew, Mark, and Luke – say it was, but John's gospel says it wasn't. However, there is a much better historical source than the gospels for this meal – 1 Corinthians 11. The reason it's better is that it contains *Jesus*' own story of that meal. We have to admit that a) Jesus was there himself at that meal, and b) his own story of the meal was best. We know this is Jesus' story of that meal because Paul tells us so: "For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that..." The Lord here is unquestionably Jesus, and Paul is telling us that this is what Jesus told him, word for word, about that meal.

So here's Jesus' story of that meal: "the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'"

This is not a Passover meal – this is a Chavurah, or fellowship or friendship meal (*chaber* means friend).

This meal can be eaten all year around, except for the night of Passover. The early Christians were eating meals together EVERY SINGLE NIGHT! So of course, it made sense that this would be their meal.

The Chavurah or Friendship meal starts with a one-sentence blessing over bread: "Blessed are you, O Lord our God, who brings forth bread from the earth." Then the leader breaks it and shares it with everyone. That's the beginning of the meal. The

leader then says a blessing for each food or dish brought. Each person is responsible for saying the blessing over their own cup, "Blessed are you, O Lord our God, who gives us this good [water, wine, grape juice, Kool-Aid...] to drink."

At the end of the meal the leader holds up a cup of wine/grape juice and says a long blessing, then shares it with the whole group. So you see then how this pattern fits exactly into the pattern of the story from Jesus in 1 Corinthians 11: the bread blessed and shared, then the meal, then the cup blessed and shared. This is the friendship meal of Jesus and the earliest churches, but with Jesus adding in the haunting words both at the beginning and the end of the meal: "Do this in remembrance of me."

On Maundy Thursday this year – March 28, gathering at 5:30 and eating at 6pm – we'll do this meal as our worship. After the meal we'll sing "Go to Dark Gethsemane" as we go upstairs to the sanctuary. Then we'll watch the stripping of the chancel while we hear Psalm 22 read. Then we'll leave in silence.

Our Good Friday service will be our usual service at 7pm, with an Easter morning breakfast at 8:30 and service at 10am.

May our Lord Jesus be with us this coming Holy Week, and I'll see you all in church!

Pastor Mark is requesting April 7th off and with the possible thousands showing up in the area we need to think of the safety and accessibility of our people. Karen Magers motioned and Tom Martin second that we should only be ONLINE and not in person on April 7th. MC.

- Christian Ed- discussed the upcoming series by Pastor Mark, spoke about 1st Communion classes and Firsts@First. VBS meeting will be the 22nd.
